Summary	RYOGENS is an electronic information sharing system, enabling any agency using the system to identify and log concerns about children and young people. Current information sharing protocols allow the sharing of information about children and young people who are thought to be showing early signs of anti-social behaviour or offending. It is anticipated that this definition of concern will be expanded with the development of broader information protocols.

### **Youth Offending Service**

# Report of the Chief Executive and Head of Youth Offending Service

#### Recommendation

Cabinet is asked to approve the recommendation for Warwickshire, subject to ODPM funding, to manage a process of transfer of the ownership of RYOGENS information sharing system from the ODPM to the software provider. This will require Warwickshire to take ownership of the product for a short, time-limited period.

#### 1.0 Introduction

This report seeks Cabinet's approval for the County Council to negotiate with the ODPM to facilitate the transfer of ownership of the RYOGENS information system to a software provider. This will be achieved by short-term ownership of the RYOGENS system by the County Council.

#### 2.0 Background

Warwickshire has been the lead Authority in this ODPM funded National Project, working in the first year with Lewisham and Tower Hamlets Councils, to develop an information sharing system to enable the identification and support of vulnerable children and young people.

The system has been successfully implemented in Warwickshire, supporting the multi-agency prevention work undertaken through the CHARM model, and it is currently being actively considered as a solution to the information sharing needs to support the integrated children's service developments.

During the second year a further three Authorities have implemented the use of RYOGENS and contributed to development of the system.

The ODPM originally indicated that they would be responsible for a national framework to sustain the products of the National Projects, but have now made a decision not to pursue this course.



#### 3. Current position

In the light of the ODPM's decision not to pursue a national framework for the products of the National Projects, a solution for the future of RYOGENS is needed. The arrangements have to be independent of ODPM finance other than a small amount possibly up to £50,000 to help a lead Authority coordinate arrangements in the first few months.

The RYOGENS Partnership Programme Board and the County Council Chief Executive have considered the options of:

- (i) The lead Authority (Warwickshire) taking ownership of the product, or in the event of this not happening,
- (ii) The product being available for "auction", initially to other Local Authorities, then possibly onto other public sector agencies or the private sector.

#### 4. Conclusion

The conclusion of lengthy deliberations and consultation about the options for the future ownership of the RYOGENS system is a recommendation that ownership should rest with the current provider of the RYOGENS software. It was concluded that, subject to ODPM financial support and legal advice, the best way of achieving this would be for Warwickshire to take initial ownership and transfer it to the software providers within 24 hours.

Concern was raised that In the event of Warwickshire not taking up the lead Authority ownership option the RYOGENS partnership would lose control over the process with ownership potentially passing to a body not of the Partnership's choice.

Discussions are currently taking place with ODPM to secure funding to cover the additional expenditure that will be incurred in managing this process and the aim is to facilitate transfer of ownership by 31st December 2005.

#### Recommendation

The Cabinet is asked to approve the recommendation for the County Council to negotiate short-term ownership of the RYOGENS system with the ODPM, subject to ODPM financial support with a view to passing this onto the current provider of the RYOGENS software within 24 hours.
