Minerals and Waste Development Scheme

Report of the Director of Planning, Transport and Economic Strategy

Recommendation

Cabinet is recommended to:-

- Endorse the submission of the proposed revision of the Minerals and Waste Development Scheme detailed in Appendix A to the Secretary of State.
- 2. Resolve that the revision be brought into effect on16th September 2005.

1. Background

Under the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, the County Council is required to adopt and regularly review a Minerals and Waste Development Scheme publicly stating its programme for the production of the Minerals and Waste Local Development Documents. Cabinet adopted a Scheme on 26th May 2005 which came into effect on 9th June.

2. Proposed Changes to the Programme

- 2.1 The Waste Development Framework element of the Scheme needs to be revised to take into account the latest expectation about the timing of key information from the Regional Technical Advisory Body relating to the waste strategy for the region. In particular, data is to be produced on the capacity of existing facilities, future waste generation and flows. The need to await this essential information means putting the timetable back by six months. The changes to the timetable required in consequence are set out in **Appendix A**.
- 2.2 In addition, to make the revised timetable more robust and to avoid frequent reviews of the Scheme other factors have been allowed for in this proposed revision :-
 - (i) The timing and implications of the Inspectors Report (e.g. although, binding, the report may result in open recommendations).
 - (ii) Possible legal challenges to the Development Plan Documents (DPDs) (since the process is new and therefore susceptible).



- (iii) Timing of Cabinet meetings.
- (iv) Overlap in the timetable of the Waste Core Strategy DPD and the Waste Allocation DPD has been removed to avoid the risk of the latter being seen as pre-empting the former.
- 2.3 A revision to the Scheme cannot take affect until the Secretary of State has been given the opportunity to intervene and, if he wishes, direct that amendments be made. Since the current timetable shows the next stage of consultation as due to commence at the end of August 2005, the Council was asked to submit the proposed revision to the Government Office for the West Midlands (GOWM) before the end of August 2005. The Director of Planning, Transport and Economic Strategy accordingly submitted a proposed revision in mid-August and this report is written in the expectation that GOWM will have given their agreement to it before your meeting. GOWM has advised that the revision will have no implications for the allocation of Planning Delivery Grant in 2005/2006 or next year.
- 2.4 Cabinet is, of course, entitled to withdraw the proposed revision and substitute another. However, that will require a fresh submission to the Secretary of State and a resolution from Cabinet at a future meeting to bring the revision into effect.
