Proposed Revision of Minerals and Waste Development Scheme

Report of the Director of Planning, Transport and Economic Strategy

Recommendation

Cabinet is recommended to resolve that the revised Minerals and Waste Development Scheme, as amended in accordance with the recommendation of the Secretary of State, be brought into effect on 25th November.

1. Background

- 1.1 The County Council is required by law to adopt and regularly review a Minerals and Waste Development Scheme. This document is essentially a timetable for producing Minerals and Waste Local Development Documents. Cabinet adopted the current Minerals and Waste Development Scheme on 26th May 2005 which consequently came into effect on 9th June 2005.
- 1.2 Cabinet was subsequently informed of our intention to review the timetable as set out in the current Minerals and Waste Development Scheme on 8th September 2005. This was to allow time to include important information arising from research carried out by the Regional Technical Advisory Body.
- 1.3 The proposed revisions were then submitted to the Government Office for the West Midlands. Complications arose due to interventions from the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM) with regard to our proposed revisions. Their concerns have now been satisfactorily addressed and **Appendix A** summarises the proposed revised Minerals and Waste Development Scheme as suggested by ODPM.

2. Proposed Revision

2.1 Appendix 3 of the Minerals and Waste Development Scheme summarises the broad timetable for the Statement of Community Involvement, the Waste Core Strategy Development Plan Documents (DPD), the Waste Allocations DPD, the Minerals Core Strategy DPD, the Minerals Allocations DPD and the Proposals Map. The revision only refers to the Waste Core Strategy DPD and the Waste Allocations DPD. All the others remain the same.

- 2.2 **Appendix A** of this report sets out the current timetable for these two Development Plan Documents alongside the two proposed revisions. The initial proposed revision is the one that was proposed to Cabinet on 8th September 2005. The final proposed revision is as a result of ODPM's modifications, all of which have been summarised in the following paragraphs.
- 2.3 The proposed revised Minerals and Waste Development Scheme submitted to Cabinet on 8th September was only partly accepted by the ODPM. The County Council suggested December 2008 as an estimated adoption date for the Waste Core Strategy, whereas the ODPM has brought that date forward to February 2008. This proposal is acceptable to the County Council because this amendment largely impacts on the Planning Inspectorate.
- 2.4 The timetable for the Waste Allocations DPD has been extended by eleven months. ODPM accepted that it would be unwise to proceed with the Allocations DPD before the Core Strategy DPD had been adopted. The revised timetable for producing the Waste Allocations DPD is challenging but achievable.
- 2.5 ODPM also deemed it no longer necessary to carry out a separate consultation with the public following submission to the Secretary of State, but instead to run them concurrently.

3. Conclusion

3.1 The proposed revision to the Minerals and Waste Development Scheme as suggested by ODPM is considered appropriate in order to progress the development of Minerals and Waste Local Development Documents.
