Citizen Focus (1)

- •Effective engagement with the public



Citizen Focus (2)

- •A say for the public on how they are policed and a statutory minimum requirement for what information each household can expect to receive
- •Organisational and cultural change to bring about increasingly responsive services where feedback from frontline staff and the public is used to continuously improve them.




<u>AIM</u>

Improving User Experience

The continued implementation of a service delivery culture

Areas of development include:-

- To develop a Call Handling capability that focuses on the needs of the end user.
- Accessible IT Systems
- An IT infrastructure that supports user requirements



National Quality Of Service Commitment

- 48 standards of service that the public can expect when contacting the police
- Implemented across all forces by November 2006
- Delivered through an Implementation Plan owned and approved by the Police Authority
- Force will be measured against the standards
- Covers all areas of Citizen Focused Policing

- Answers sustainable solutions & feedback






Professionalising the Business of Neighbourhood Policing

- Intelligence led targeting of the issues that matter most to the public
- Joint action by the police partner agencies and the public

Definition of Neighbourhood

- A geographic area defined through local agreement of police, partners and public.....
- A Neighbourhood Policing team may service one or several neighbourhoods dependent on the level of demand and size of the neighbourhoods......



Signal Crime Research

- Neighbourhoods defined with local people
- Identify neighbourhood concerns & priorities
- Target issues that matter most to the public in their neighbourhoods
- 8 Wards in Warwickshire (selected through joint consultation)
- Will identify key areas for joint action






