JSNA Adult Mental Health Needs Assessment Transformation Group Consultation

Summary / Recommendations

The commissioners and authors' of the Adult Mental Health Needs Assessment provided responses to their consultation process with the Transformation Group and are shared with the Joint Commissioning Group for consideration and identification of any lessons or improvements.

1 Introduction

The Transformation Group were asked to provide feedback to the JSNA Working Group in December 2012 with regard to the Adult Mental Health Needs Assessment. A joint response to this feedback was provided by the commissioners and authors' of the Adult Mental Health Needs Assessment.

2 Improvements

As a result of this consultation, the following responses were made:

- Publication of the needs assessment was delayed as a result of the numbers of chapters
 required to cover Mental Health services. As such, many commissioners and groups needed
 to be consulted regarding the content and recommendations made. Although there were
 some concerns that the delay may give an impression of 'old data', by having so many
 chapters, the profile of mental health and its importance for the population was raised.
- With the JSNA Commissioning Group now up and running, it is expected that the signing off
 process will be faster, to ensure more up to date information is considered by the NHS and
 the Local Authority. This will help speed up the publication of needs assessments, whilst
 being mindful that data sources can often be 2 to 3 years out of date, even when the most
 recent data available is used on the date of publication.
- Each chapter has been included separately on the JSNA website to help break down the size of the document and make it easier to find the issues that are of interest.
- The Local Authority is aware that not everyone is able to access the internet or such a long document, and is identifying ways to make the document (and future ones) more accessible.
- The Local Authority is also aware of the need to ensure that the recommendations in needs
 assessments are followed up and reported on, to ensure that the investment of time and
 effort actually helps the local population. The JSNA Commissioning Group and the JSNA
 Working Group are actively looking at ways to receive updates from the relevant
 commissioners as to how recommendations are being actioned.

3 Next Steps

These responses are shared with the Joint commissioning Group on 13th March 2013 with the suggestion that they are adopted going forward.
