Item 2 – Action notes and logs from 22nd May 2013

Item 3 – Proposed Project Prioritisation and Approval

GW and ST presented the three projects' briefs and prioritisation scores, scoped and prioritised by the JSNA working Group to date, for review and approval.

Commissioning Group Decisions

- The *Drivers of Wellbeing project* priority was agreed at 14, although it was rejected at present. Its name was also amended to the *Happiness Project*. Instead, we will:
 - Review the NA template to ensure it adequately considers the inclusion of subjective measures of wellbeing, when addressing other topics.
 - Await the publication of the second year of ONS data to see if the findings are replicated.
 - o Include some happiness perceptions questions in the proposed Living in Warwickshire Survey.
- The prioritisation and approval of the *Delaying Parenthood in Looked After Children (LAC)* was deferred until the September meeting, as it was felt the project sponsors were required to be present to justify its prioritisation and answer questions. This was also thought to be required for all future project proposals.
- The *Mental Health Needs Assessment* was also deferred to September, as its sponsor, Becky Hale, was not present. In addition, it was felt that due to recent work on the subject area, the scope should be adjusted to only address deficiencies in the existing NA, if they exist.

ST outlined the current JSNA Programme of work consisting of the Autism Needs Assessment, Learning Disabilities Needs Assessment and the Impact of the Welfare Reforms Assessment projects, and the Data Integration and Communications Work-Streams. ST informed the group that the Autism NA's scope had changed and work extended by about a month to the middle of August, with an AMBER status. This had also impacted on the LD NA as it required the same resource. Consequently, it also has an AMBER Status and is forecast to be completed late, in the middle of Dec. The Impact of the Welfare Reforms Assessment has a GREEN status but has no fixed deadline. The two Work-Streams are covered below.

Item 5 – Data Integration

AD described the activity currently underway, consisting of a consultation with Commissioners, led by Rob Mantell to ascertain their self-service data requirements and preferences; and the development of an Dementia LIS report as a 'proof of concept'. All activity has a GREEN status.

Item 6 – Website and Communications

GW and ST outlined the improved communications support the JSNA was receiving from Jack Linstead in WCC. GW described the distribution and communications support to the release of the 2013 JSNA Annual Update but highlighted the low numbers of direct mail recipients opening or reading it. ST described the forthcoming work on Health and Wellbeing related web platforms.
