North Warwickshire Area Performance 2005/06 and Area Business Plan 2006/07

Report of the Strategic Director - Policy and Development

Recommendation

That the North Warwickshire Area Committee:

- 1. comments on progress made against milestone targets and key performance indicators contained in the 2005/06 Area Business Plan and
- 2. endorses actions/milestones and targets contained in the new 2006/07 Area Business Plan.

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 The 2005/06 North Warwickshire Area Business Plan was agreed by this Area Committee on 8 June 2005. It contained details of actions and milestone targets proposed for delivery by Warwickshire County Council Departments in the North Warwickshire area over a 12-month period. The plan was based around the six Corporate Objectives of the County Council and sought to illustrate the ways in which the County Council, as a strategic authority, tailored and delivered its services to address local needs. The following report outlines the council's success in delivering those actions.
- 1.2 This report:
 - a) looks back on the year 2005/06 and assesses the progress that has been made by departments in pursuing the various milestone targets and actions that they set out to reach a year ago and,
 - b) introduces the 2006/07 Area Business Plan.

2.0 2005/06 Actions and Performance

2.1 **Appendix A** of this report provides data relating to performance against the key target indicators and progress made towards meeting the milestone targets that were proposed for this area by the county council's departments. Where possible, a commentary has been provided by directorates.

- 2.2 Members will note that the colour coding or traffic lighting used in this report differs from that used in previous years in that it uses the red, blue and green system. The decision to use a new system was made by the Corporate Policy Reference Group in February 2006 in response to stated concerns that the red, amber, green system, with its generic tolerances of 6 months delay or plus or minus 10% against performance was inflexible. It is important that the reader appreciates that the new system involves more than just a change in the colours used, rather it shifts the emphasis very firmly so that the objective must be to **hit** the target. In the past it has been considered acceptable to exceed a target. To do so is not necessarily considered acceptable as it suggests that either excess resources have been used or projects have been inadequately planned.
- 2.3 A second refinement to the monitoring and reporting system is that tolerances against targets are to be less forgiving but more flexible. This means that where a tolerance of plus or minus six months was previously used, that has now been reduced to two months for the majority of milestone targets. A similar approach has been adopted for the performance indicators in that tolerances are tighter and yet flexible. The expectation is that this new system will not only enhance Members' and our customers awareness of the quality of service we are providing, but will also aid directorates in their planning of local service delivery. The tables below summarises the new system.

Milestones

RED - Greater than or equal to 2 months after the Milestone Date. **BLUE** - Between 0 and 2 months after the Milestone Date. **GREEN** - Before the Milestone Date.

Performance Indicators

RED - Greater than 5% below the Target Value. **BLUE** - Between the Target Value+2% and the Target Value-5%. **GREEN** - Greater than 2% above the Target Value.

- 2.4 To assist the interpretation of the information contained in appendix A the following bullet points highlight some of the headline achievements of the County Council in the area.

- 2.5 In light of the information provided, the Area Committee may wish to identify any issues it wishes to explore further.

3.0 The 2006/07 North Warwickshire Area Business Plan

3.1 As well as reflecting on last year's performance, it is important to give regard to what the County Council will be doing in the North Warwickshire area in this financial year.

3.2 Attached at **Appendix B** is a copy of the North Warwickshire Area Business Plan 2006/07. It sets out the milestone actions and performance targets for the area. As in previous years the plan should be regarded as an extension of the County Council's Corporate Business Plan. Members will be aware that the Corporate Business Plan for this year has been structured around the Local Area Agreement Blocks (as opposed to the corporate objectives). This approach has been adopted for the Area Business Plan.

4.0 Summary

4.1 This report has focused on the actions of the county council's directorates during 2005/06 and the way in which they have sought to the best service to the people of North Warwickshire. Members' views are now sought on the progress made to date and what is planned to happen in the future.
