Community Development Fund 2006/07

Report of the Strategic Director of Performance & Development

Recommendations

Area Committee:

- (1) comments on last year's successful applications
- (2) confirms eligibility of this year's applications
- (3) determines which applications should receive a grant
- (4) determines the level of funding to be received by each successful application.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 This is the seventh year that applications to the Community Development Fund (CDF) have been decided by Area Committee.
- 1.2The aim of the Fund is 'to provide new opportunities for local people, particularly those who experience disadvantage or exclusion from mainstream activities'.
- 1.3 This year North Warwickshire Area Committee received more applications than the other four Committees and was the only area to receive an increase in applications on the previous year. Across the County 107 applications were received which included 31 from North Warwickshire.
- 1.4A summary of all the projects considered by North Warwickshire Area Committee is given in **Appendix C**
- 1.5 The total County fund for this year stands at £167,310. This is divided between the five district and borough areas using a formula based on the Index of Multiple Deprivation (the level of deprivation, the size of the population and access to services within an area). The allocations are as follows:

North Warwickshire	£22,280
Nuneaton and Bedworth	£53,910
Rugby	£26,460
Stratford	£32,680
Warwick	£31,980



2. A Review of Last Year's funded projects

- 2.1 Last round, eleven projects were funded to a value of £22,280. Three of the projects supported Pre-schools to provide a better learning environment for their young pupils. Two more supported groups to update their IT equipment. A further three projects promoted sport and leisure activities for both younger and older generations. Two schools projects promoted music and financial skills. The final project was part of a Heritage Lottery bid to improve the grounds of Polesworth Abbey.
- 2.2 Nine of the projects have been completed successfully and have returned their end of project reports. In all cases the funding was spent in accordance with the application forms and the committee's recommendations.
- 2.3 Of the two remaining projects New Way Credit Union is on course to complete its school banking project by the end of the year. We are waiting for feedback from Fillongley Pre-school who have had a change of personnel.
- 2.4 See Appendix B for further details.
- 2.5 Members might like to comment on the successes of these projects.

3. This Year's application process

3.1This year, applications were invited from 22nd May with a closing date of 22nd September.

Publicity

- 3.2The fund was publicised locally. Press releases were sent to 'The Herald' newspaper. Announcements were made at all four local Area Forums and application forms were available from all seven local libraries and the mobile library.
- 3.3 Locally, officers from North Warwickshire Borough Council and those representing the Community & Voluntary sector infrastructure organisations (including CVS, WRCC, The Volunteer Centre), were also supplied with application forms to hand out to appropriate groups and organisations.
- 3.4Davina Key, Community Development Worker, CVS promoted the fund widely to community groups and helped to support 10 applications to this year's round.
- 3.5County Councillors were also given application forms to hand out at their discretion.

Consultation



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- 3.6 Consultation was undertaken with officers from across County Council directorates and with external partners. This was to clarify the relationship of applications to mainstream funding and to minimise the risk of inappropriate funding and duplication of support.
- 3.7 Officers were given a summary of all 31 applications received. They were asked to pass comment and invited to attend a review meeting on 9th October to look at all applications in greater detail. The meeting proved very useful and helped in particular to identify other sources of funding available for certain projects. The meeting was attended by four officers.
- 3.8 Members were also sent the same summary sheet and invited to a Funding subgroup meeting on 1st November to go through this year's applications and pass comment. The meeting was attended by four Members.

Site Visits

3.9The Community Partnership Officer from the Area Team visited over half of the projects. He met with applicants to assess the need for the project and to find out more information about the proposal. These visits proved very useful in helping to gain additional information to score each application appropriately. The visits were conducted over a 10 day period in mid October.

1.0 Eligibility and Scoring of bids

- 1.1 Each application was evaluated against the eligibility and scoring criteria set out in the application guidance. The recommendation of those successful projects and the amounts that each should receive are set out in **Appendix A** and summarised in paragraph 5.4 below. The process that was followed is summarised below.
- 1.2 The application arrangements require that in order to qualify for a grant an application must satisfy the following entry criteria.

To be eligible to apply for the Community Development Fund, projects MUST:

- ✓ provide new opportunities for local people or develop the capacity of local people to run their own projects
- ✓ provide lasting benefit
- ✓ contribute to local strategic priorities
- ✓ require a maximum of £5,000 from this Fund
- ✓ be looking to spend the grant within 12 months of its award
- ✓ be led by a community or voluntary organisation
- ✓ have the support of a Warwickshire County Councillor
- ✓ be led by or otherwise supported by a fully constituted organisation with its own bank account

The Community Development Fund WILL NOT fund:

- The running costs of an established group or activities which are that group's main service
- Contribution to large scale and/or ongoing refurbishment, building or maintenance

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- One off events e.g. daytrips (other than capacity building events)
- * Any costs incurred before the grant is awarded
- Services which are a group's statutory responsibility
- × Religious practises
- Statutory organisations
- ✗ Profit-making organisations

Projects which have been previously funded by the CDF, although groups which have previously been funded by the CDF may apply for a new project so long as any previous projects have been completed.

- 4.3All applications have been scored out of 20 possible points against a number of factors relating to:
 - (i) Location (deprivation) up to 4 points
 - (ii) Reducing inequalities up to 2 points
 - (iii) Community involvement up to 3 points
 - (iv) Community benefit up to 3 points
 - (v) Sustainability up to 3 points
 - (vi) Partnership working 1 point
 - (vii) Quality up to 2 points
 - (vii) Strategic priorities up to 2 points
- 4.4**Appendix C** provides a summary of all the applications received. The table indicates each projects eligibility, its final score and recommendation for funding. Where funding has not been recommended in most cases an alternative funding soruce has been identified.

Members are required to confirm whether they support these views for each project. Each application has been scored irrespective of their eligibility should members wish to regard any of them as qualifying for a grant.

5 Allocation of Grants

- 5.1The amount available for North Warwickshire this year is £22,280.
- 5.2 The total amount requested by the 31 applicants is over £85,000 of which the "eligible" bids total over £70,000
- 5.3 Clearly it is not possible to fund all of these applications. In previous years the general practice has been to award grants to the highest scoring "eligible" applications. This usually involves a process of choosing between applications with the same number of points or reducing the grants to a particular points threshold in order to fit with the money available. It is suggested that this might be achieved as follows.
- 5.3 It is recommended that fourteen projects are funded. They are a good mix of groups benefiting a diverse group of users.

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- 5.4 Five of the projects would support Village Hall committees to upgrade their facilities and attract more user groups. Three Pre-schools would benefit from providing a better learning environment to their young pupils. Two local organisations should become more sustainable by supporting them to take on new opportunities and areas of business. Two more local groups would receive support to accommodate new members. The remaining two projects would see training provision for a local residents association and the setting up of a new young women's group.
- 5.5 All fourteen projects scored either 13 points or above.
- 5.6 To enable fourteen projects to be supported, two are recommended to be fully funded whilst the remainder are recommended to be part funded from their original requests. The funding of all 14 projects should allow each to accomplish the core business of their project and give due consideration to further sources of funding.
- 5.7 See Appendix A for the list of proposed projects for funding this year.
