Recommendation

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 At the Area Committee meeting on 26 July 2006 members reviewed progress against the 2005/06 Area Business Plan and considered the 2006/07 draft Area Business Plan. Members requested that each section of the North Warwickshire Area Business Plan 2005/06 be considered separately at subsequent future meetings with lead officers invited to attend to explain performance and proposed actions.
- 1.2 The Area Committee agreed to consider the objective to 'Promote the Health and Social Care of our Citizens' at this meeting.

2.0 2005/06 Actions and Performance

2.1 **Appendix A** details the County Council's performance in 2005-06 against the Business Plan objective to 'Promote the Health and Social Care of our Citizens'

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- 2.2 The following points for discussion are noted from the Area Committee meeting held on 26 July Members:
 - i) Explanation sought as to what is the 'enhanced system for monitoring reimbursable delayed transfers of care at the George Eliot Hospital'.
 - ii) Looked After Children stability. Indicators: percentage of children looked after with 3 or more placements during the year and percentage of children looked after adopted during the year require actuals for 05/06.
 - iii) Progress information required on the number of schools working towards a Warwickshire Health Promotion Schools Scheme accreditation.
