# Review of North Warwickshire Area Business Plan 2005/06

### Report of the Strategic Director of Performance and Development

#### Recommendation

- 1. Notes the Performance Report for 2005-6 in respect of 'Improve the Environment', 'Reduce Crime and Improve the Safety of the Community' and 'Ensure Sound Governance of the County Council to provide Accessible, Responsive and Well-Managed Services'
- 2. Comment on the report as members see fit with special reference to issues which they might wish to have discussed in further detail.

### 1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 At the Area Committee meeting on 26 July 2006 members reviewed progress against the 2005/06 Area Business Plan and considered the 2006/07 draft Area Business Plan. Members requested that each section of the North Warwickshire Area Business Plan 2005/06 be considered separately at subsequent future meetings with lead officers invited to attend to explain performance and proposed actions.
- 1.2 The Area Committee has to date considered the two largest sections 'Promote Lifelong Learning and Personal Development' and 'Promote the Health and Social Care of our Citizens'. The remaining three sections have been brought collectively to this meeting due to their individual size and in order to complete this process within the current financial year.

### 2.0 2005/06 Actions and Performance

2.1 **Appendix A** details the County Council's performance in 2005-06 against the Business Plan objectives to 'Improve the Environment', 'Reduce Crime and Improve the Safety of the Community' and 'Ensure

Sound Governance of the County Council to provide Accessible, Responsive and Well-Managed Services'

2.2 No points for discussion were noted from the Area Committee meeting held on 26 July.

#### 3.0 Summary
