Report of the Area Community Learning Partnership

Recommendations:

- (1) That the progress made in the development of the Community Learning Strategy and the multi-agency Community Learning Plan for North Warwickshire Borough is noted.

1. Background

1.1 The development of the Community Learning Strategy and multi-agency Community Learning Plans enable the Local Authority and all partner organisations:

- To engage in new ways with the local community, so that learners, parents and carers, and our partners are all working together to help learners of all ages to achieve their potential.
- To enhance communication and understanding across the range of learning provision.
- To ensure that increasingly complex arrangements for learning:
 - Are planned more coherently to avoid needless duplication
 - Have agencies working together – not in competition with each other
 - Seek to respond to the differing needs of local communities
 - Are subject to local democratic scrutiny.

- 1.2 The Area Community Learning Partnership (ACLP), which has met regularly since April 2003, is co-ordinated and serviced by the Schools and Communities Team of the Children, Young People and Families Directorate and is the vehicle through which the Area Community Learning Plan has been developed.
- 1.3 The ACLP is currently the 'Lifelong Learning Theme Group' for the North Warwickshire Partnership (Local Strategic Partnership).
- 1.4 Progress against the 2006/07 action plan was monitored by the Partnership on a regular basis and all partner agencies contributed to the process. A full progress report for 2006/07 is attached at **Appendix A**.

2. The Area Community Learning Plan 2005/08

- 2.1 Progress made against the Community Learning Plan for 2006/07 has been encouraging and has given partner agencies a firm basis to build upon when considering future working.
- 2.2 The ACLP is a key vehicle for supporting the extended services agenda within localities. It is also key to encouraging a multi-agency response to meeting the objectives of the Local Area Agreement allowing flexibility and providing local solutions.
- 2.3 Attached as **Appendix B**, Members will find a draft outline plan for 2007/08. This document includes a brief summary of progress to date along with a partnership activity action plan for 2007/08.
- 2.4 As a Theme Group of the North Warwickshire Partnership, the ACLP has been closely involved with the development of the Sustainable Community Strategy for the Borough.
- 2.5 The ACLP welcomes the comments of Area Committee and will look to finalise the plan in late May/early June. A copy of the finalised plan will be shared with Members in the summer.

FOREWORD

The Area Community Learning Partnership is the Lifelong Learning Theme Group of the Local Strategic Partnership, North Warwickshire Community Partnership. The Partnership reflects a multi agency approach to meeting the priority needs across the area.

In 2005 the Partnership produced a plan containing a summary of work previously undertaken and the plans and aspirations for the period through to 2008. It is now time to review progress made during 2006/07 and to consider the focus for 2007/08. The Community Learning Plan progress report 2006/07 and action plan 2007/08 has been produced accordingly. This document should be read in conjunction with the more detailed North Warwickshire Area Community Learning Plan 2005/08.

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WHAT IS THE AREA COMMUNITY LEARNING PARTNERSHIP?

The Area Community Learning Partnership (ACLP) is the Education and Lifelong Learning “Theme Group” of the Local Strategic Partnership, North Warwickshire Community Partnership. The ACLP consists of representatives of local government, health, education bodies, business, and voluntary and community organisations. It operates by bringing the various agencies together to learn from and influence each other in the interests of the people of North Warwickshire. This plan describes their commitment to cooperate in order to improve learning opportunities for people in the area.

The vision of the Community Partnership draws attention to the need for people in North Warwickshire to increase their attainment in Education and Lifelong Learning in order to enjoy a better quality of life and contribute to more vibrant communities. It is the role of the ACLP to find ways to bring this about.

The aim of the Area Community Learning Partnership (ACLP) is therefore

To ensure that people of all ages are provided with the opportunity to obtain the skills, knowledge, confidence and understanding to achieve their full potential

The ACLP is looking to raise awareness of the benefits of learning and to improve the skills of the people of North Warwickshire in order to attract a more diverse range of employers and an increased spread of employment opportunities.

The ACLP will aim to ensure that our work reflects the rural nature of the borough and that equality and ethnicity issues are seen as being an integral element of all we do.

OUR LONGER TERM PRIORITIES AND FOCUS

The Partnership is looking at new ways to raise achievement and aspirations within the Borough. We will work in partnership to develop holistic solutions through community involvement and intergenerational learning. We aim to increase knowledge about provision within the Borough and to increase the number of people actively engaged in learning. Our progress will also be measured against the percentage of Year 11 pupils achieving 5+ GCSEs at A-C and the percentage of Year 11 pupils achieving positive destinations as well as an increase in the number of adults with qualifications at level 2 or above.

OUR VISION FOR 2005/08

The Area Community Learning Partnership has identified the following issues as priorities for collaborative working over the three-year period 2005-2008. These issues will be reviewed on an annual basis and updated accordingly. Any changes will be seen in the part of the document detailing the focus for 2007/08:

PRIORITY ONE To identify barriers to achievement and participation and to promote joint work between agencies and with the voluntary sector to help overcome those barriers.

PRIORITY TWO To promote the community and extended use of schools and community based provision and the promotion and development of family learning and early years provision.

PRIORITY THREE To support the priorities of the Strategic Plan for Children and Young People.

PRIORITY FOUR To bring greater coherence to adult and community learning initiatives and to skills for working, including skills and access to ICT.

WHAT HAVE WE DONE SO FAR?

The ACLP first met in April 2003 and during that time the membership has changed to ensure the most appropriate liaison and collaboration between partner agencies.

Regular meetings are held to ensure information sharing and to encourage the effective use of resources within the Borough.

Partner agencies have continued to work throughout the Borough to ensure that people have opportunities to learn close to where they work or live. Our regular meetings have resulted in a significantly improved understanding of the roles and responsibilities of partners agencies, leading to better information sharing and more 'joined-up working'.

We have set up a Sub Group with a specific focus on the publicity and promotion of learning within the Borough. Leaflets and posters have been produced promoting all forms of learning and have given one-stop shop contact details for people to find out about learning opportunities and work.

Role models have been identified and leaflets produced to show the impact learning has had on some of the residents of North Warwickshire. Further role models will be identified and leaflets produced to ensure an on-going awareness of the benefits of learning.

A Sub Group has been formed with a specific focus on developing new ways of working with those individuals or communities often seen as being hard to reach by learning providers. This has enabled us to secure funding to trial new ways of working and to ensure that agencies are able to make a longer-term impact in areas of need.

Two learning events took place during the summer of 2006. These events gave people the opportunity to try a number of different activities in a fun and informal way as well as providing information about learning opportunities in the area. Follow up activities began in January 2007.

We are delighted with the attendance at the learning events in the summer and the take up of the follow up activities. We had hoped to have a total of 50 people at each event in the summer when numbers were actually over 200 on each day. Follow up work in Kingsbury has been extremely rewarding with almost 20 people starting a multi activity 6 week programme. A significant number of those starting the programme have expressed an interest in taking up woodwork and it is hoped to offer an appropriate course after Easter. Improved and sustained partnership working has been key to the success. New ways of working have been explored with focussed publicity and promotion undertaken.

We have set up a Sub Group to look at issues around locality working and work has also taken place to build collaborative partnerships between a range of learning providers for young people aged 14 – 19 years.

The ACLP has been extremely supportive of the development of extended services and children's centres within the borough. Both will see access to services for children and families enhanced and represent a joined up approach to providing what the neighbourhood needs in a location which is convenient to them.

Strong links have been developed with Health and we hope that this will continue through the health trainer initiative.
