1. Introduction

- 1.1 This report outlines the key decisions of the Funding Sub-Group at its meeting held on 24th October 2007. The report focuses on the following areas:
 - **Community Development Fund:** An update on past CDF allocations and approval of applications in the current year.
 - Community Computers: Approval of applications for 2007/08.
 - Arts for Health: Approval for a Project
 - **Social Inclusion Fund:** Approval for a project to cover the specific allocation that was available to tackle anti-social behaviour.
 - Well Being: Approval for two applications and three end of year project reports.
 - Youth Development Grant: Nomination of three members to work with Youth Forum on the allocation of the Youth Work Development Grant.

2. Community Development Fund

2.1 A summary of completed applications is attached as Appendix A to this report. As members will note all applications have been completed and final reports submitted. Appendix B contains a list of applications for approval in the current financial year together with the rationale for the selection.

3. Community Computers

3.1 Attached as Appendix C is a list of applications for Community Computers in 2007/08. A total of 14 applications have been received which means that 6 are still available for distribution. Work is currently underway to explore take up of the remaining computers. This will also involve informing potential applicants of the availability of laptops.

4. Arts for Health

- 4.1 £50,000 was allocated to the County Arts Service divided equally across the five boroughs/districts. It is proposed that the £10,000 allocation is used as part of a countywide project to promote dance for health activities. A countywide approach has ensured that the viability of the project is secured through the leverage of external funds.
- 4.2 In North Warwickshire it is proposed that a pilot project will be held in Atherstone Leisure Centre involving young women. This will involve both taster and workshop sessions and a key aim will be to address the issue of obesity through arts and physical activity.

5. Social Inclusion Fund

5.1 Members will be aware that at the July meeting of the Committee; it was reported that a sum of £6000 was available to address community safety issues principally around anti social behaviour. The instruction at that meeting was that the fund be publicised through the local CDRP and as a

result a proposals has been put forward entitled the 'Responsible Drinking Programme'.

5.2 The Programme addresses the substantial link between alcohol consumption and anti social behaviour by using the 'CragRats' a drama company to hold interactive workshops with all five secondary schools in North Warwickshire and the Pupil Referral Unit based in Keresley (attended by excluded North Warwickshire pupils). At the end of the session the Company will seek to establish an infrastructure to enable schools to conduct their own workshops in the future. A sum of £6600 has been requested and it is proposed that the additional £600 required be absorbed within the overall SIF allocation for the Year.

6. Well Being Fund

- 6.1 Two applications have been received in relation to:
 - Retail Support and Business Development in Polesworth (£6800): This project seeks to overcome the decline in visitor numbers to Polesworth by improving the image of the town centre through small grants to local retailers to improve shop frontages.
 - Development of the Atherstone Booktown Project (£3000): This project seeks to assist in marketing activities to promote the booktown and more crucially attract new booksellers to the town.
- 6.2 Members are asked to note the following three End of Year Project reports:

Local Skills for Local Need (£5,000)

Warwickshire Wildlife Trust has completed this project satisfactorily, with some good outcomes achieved. The project set out to train local people who were not in work or education to provide them with skills in habitat conservation. The training course was held over 6 weeks at Kingsbury Water Park and helped to restore a number of wetland habitats on site. This final report highlights the achievements of the 9 individuals following completion of the training. The main achievement being that 3 of the participants are now in full time employment.

The Trust are now in the process of developing another skills training programme to replicate the success of this project.

Alcohol Awareness Training (£500)

Community Alcohol Service Coventry & Warwickshire has completed this project satisfactorily. One training event on Alcohol Awareness was delivered in Polesworth to 9 members of staff in the Voluntary & Community Sector who are in contact with alcohol misusing individuals.

The training should assist workers in their role and encourage referrals on to Swanswell Trust and Connexions who have specialist alcohol workers.

Healthy Living/Personal Safety Workshops-NEETS (£2523)

Millennium Volunteers has completed this project satisfactorily, with some good outcomes achieved. The project took 8 young people who were not in education, training or employment and supported them through a 4 week programme of different activities to boost their self confidence, improve their general outlook; raise awareness of leading healthier lifestyles; and raising standards in basic life skills.

The training was delivered in partnership with Connexions, North Warwickshire & Hinckley College and Warwickshire Youth Service. Out of the 8 young people. 2 Young people now have full time jobs. 3 young people have completed the Princes Trust Programme and 1 has enrolled onto a full time college course. Connexions are working with the other 2 young people to ensure they move into positive outcomes

Millennium Volunteers have received further funding from Connexions to run another course with NEET young people in 2007/08. They are currently looking for funding to add a healthy living extension to the course as it proved to be so successful this time.

7. Youth Development Grant

7.1 A total of £23, 880 has been made available to North Warwickshire through the Youth Development Grant. The Grant is administered through the joint involvement of the local Youth Forum and three members of the Area Committee. (Councillors Fowler, Grant and Sweet as recommended above)
