# Report of the Strategic Director of Performance & Development

### Recommendation

That the Area Committee accept the recommendation of the Funding Sub-Group to:

Commission another annual round of jointly-funded, local projects, to meet the Sustainable Community Plan actions contained in "Shaping Our Future" 2007-21, by contributing £40,000 of Well-being Funds to match-fund a joint process with Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council.

#### 1 Introduction

1.1 The Well-being Fund for commissioned projects currently stands at £81,670.

#### 2 Process for Commissions

- 2.1 Commissions can be developed to meet the Local Sustainable Community Plan priorities or to meet chosen Area Committee priorities. Current Area Committee priorities include Fear of Crime, Anti Poverty and Community Involvement. It is also expected that Area Committees will develop new priorities for funding through the development of projects aimed to achieve Local Area Agreement in the Nuneaton and Bedworth area.
- 2.2 Local Sustainable Community Plan commissions are developed through Theme Groups of the Local Strategic Partnership (LSP) and filtered through the LSP Advisory Group and the Area Committee's Funding Subgroup. Other commissions are developed through the Local Area Managers Group and referred to the Area Committee's Funding Sub-group. The Area Manager is present on all three groups receiving commissions for consideration. Additionally the Area Committee Funding Sub-group can recommend appropriate commissions based on its chosen priorities.



- 2.3 Members of the Funding Sub-group, met on 18 July, 2007 and following on from discussions about the previous success attained from the joint funded process with the Borough Council, it was agreed to seek approval from the Area Committee to continue the process for a further year.
- 2.4 Match funding of £40,000 is required to undertake the joint project this year. Attached at **Appendix A** are details of projects funded from last year's programme.
- 2.5 As in previous years, the projects will be decided upon by an intergenerational panel of local people who will be selected and assisted by the Area Committee Chair and officers from the Borough and County Council.
- 2.6 The Funding Sub-group recommends this project for approval, which would leave a remaining balance for the Well-being Fund of £41,670 for the current financial year.
