## Urgent Decision Proposed to be taken by the Portfolio Holder for Finance and Property on 20 June 2017

# S278 Highway Improvement Scheme at A426 Leicester Road, Rugby

#### Recommendation

The Portfolio Holder for Finance and Property gives approval to:

- 1) increase the capital programme provision for the S278 highway improvement scheme at A426 Leicester Road, Rugby, to £1.8m;
- 2) the award of the contract for the S278 highway improvement scheme at A426 Leicester Road, Rugby, to the supplier who has submitted the most economically advantageous price subject to the applicable S278 Agreement with the Developer having been signed.

#### 1.0 Key Issues

- 1.1 On 17 March 2017 the Portfolio for Finance and Property gave approval to include the (Highways Act 1980) Section 278 highway improvement scheme at A426 Leicester Road, Rugby, to the 2017/ 2018 capital programme. The estimated cost, including works and fees, was £1.2m.
- 1.2 The S278 works are required as part of the planning consent given by Rugby Borough Council for an extension to the Elliot's Field retail development on the former Tribune Trading Estate. The works comprise the addition of a fourth arm at the A426 Leicester Road / Technology Drive traffic signal controlled junction. The Developer (Hammerson plc) will be providing 100% of the funding for the scheme via the (Highways Act 1980) Section 278 Agreement which will be signed before the construction contract is awarded.
- 1.3 The procurement of the works is through a Package Order Call Off Contract (POCOC) under Warwickshire County Council's Provision of Construction Works Framework Contract. The Framework Contract was established in April 2014 following an EU procurement process. The Framework contract comprises five Framework Lots (identified by financial value and / or nature of work). Successful applicants were awarded a place as a supplier within a Framework Lot following evaluation of Lot-specific ITT questionnaire responses provided by each of the tendering applicants. A Lot-specific POCOC for a particular Work Package is awarded following further competition between suppliers for the Lot to which the Work Package relates. Further competition is on the basis of price alone.
- 1.4 All of the seven named suppliers in the appropriate lot of the Framework were invited to submit quotations for these works on 28 April 2017, with a tender return date of 09 June 2017. Three suppliers returned quotations, the lowest of which exceeds the £1.2m estimate.

1.5 Warwickshire County Council's Contract Standing Orders (September 2013) Section 2.3 states that authority to award a major contract between £1.0m and £3.0m requires a report back to the relevant Portfolio Holder where the bids exceed the original estimate by 10% or more.

#### 2.0 Proposal

- 2.1 Approval is requested to increase the capital programme provision to £1.8m to cover the cost of the works and fees, and an allowance for contingencies. There is no financial risk to Warwickshire County Council as S278 schemes are fully funded by the Developer's contribution which is ring-fenced for the works specified. For Developer funded schemes, there are no alternative uses for the contribution and it does not affect the overall level of available capital resources.
- 2.2 Approval is requested to award the contract to the supplier who has provided the most economically advantageous price following assessment of the tenders.
- 2.3 If the recommendations are not approved, it will be necessary to re-tender the highway works. The tenders can only be sent to the same suppliers as before and the responses may be similar. Furthermore, delaying the highway works to complete a new tender exercise will affect the ability of the Developer to meet its planning obligations in time for the programmed opening date of the retail development at the beginning of December.

### 3.0 Timescales associated with the decision and next steps

3.1 If the recommendation is approved, the contract will be awarded to the supplier who has provided the most economically advantageous price at the earliest possible date and highway works will commence as soon as the supplier is able to mobilise their resources.
