Thank you for your correspondence regarding the proposed puffin crossing on Tachbrook Road.

We have selected this location after consultation with the local County Councillor and carrying out traffic and pedestrian surveys to ascertain where the desire line is for pedestrians to cross the road.

The proposed puffin crossing is included in the programme of works aimed at improving routes to school. In this location there were over 70 school aged children crossing the road within the 12 hr period surveyed.

With regard to the petition that is talked of; as yet the County Council has not received a petition. In fact only two residents have raised any formal objections to the crossing. The consultation period is to

run until the end of this week (3/3/17), so any other representations or objections must be received in writing by that date.

Other members of the community are fully in favour of the crossing, and have written to us, adding their support.

All letters of objection or support will be reported to the Portfolio Holder for Community Safety in due course.

This project is not essentially about calming traffic, it is about providing a safe place for children to cross this busy road on their way to school each day. Any other issues regarding road safety or speed of traffic etc, should be expressed to your County Councillor, or Police representatives in relation to excessive speed.

Thank you for your interest in this matter, but I must decline your kind offer of a meeting.

We the undersigned **OBJECT** to the installation of a Puffin crossing on Tachbrook Road for some or all of the following reasons:

- 1: Increased traffic noise to immediate residents.
- 2: Increased fumes from stationary traffic to the young children of affected residents. (Leamington has some of the worst air pollution in the country (Source: WHO 2017) and Tachbrook Road already suffers high traffic fumes.)
- 3: Increased light pollution to immediate residents.
- 4: Beeping and added noise pollution in an already noise-polluted area.
- 5: The complete removal of parking and unloading rights for residents on the west side of the proposed site.
- 6: The knock-on impact of parking in surrounding streets (St George's Road and Claremont Road) with the proposed parking/unloading restrictions due to zig-zags.

Dear Carolyn Burrows

I have received notification that there will be a consultation on the proposal to make a puffin crossing outside my house on Tachbrook Road. [REDACTED] and I am an owner /occupier. I have objections to this proposal on several counts and although I agree that traffic calming measures are needed on Tachbrook Road I believe there are ways of achieving this without the distress this proposed crossing will cause to the people who live on this part of the street. I'd like to outline my personal objections and I aim to get further support from the wider neighborhood/community.

Because there are a number of student houses in this area it may seem, during this consultation, that the objections are not as vociferous as they would be if all the residents on this strip were less transient. Students, of course, do not have the same investment in the place they live – lovely as they are. And so this must be taken into account when reviewing objections. Owner/occupiers and long-term residents, though few and far between, should be listened to.

The noise of Tachbrook Road is already alarming at certain times of day. I am often woken by it at 6am. This crossing will not change that. In fact, putting a crossing directly outside my home – pretty much outside my bedroom and office window – will mean that at certain times of day traffic will stop and start and literally converge outside my door. There will be constant beeping outside my bedroom and my office (I work from home 3 days a week and I am an academic and a writer). There will be nowhere for me or my neighbors to park and unload shopping or deliveries. [REDACTED]

I am invested in this part of town. I am one of a handful of long-term owner occupier residents – I have lived here since 1999 and brought my children up here. This proposal, if it goes through, could push me away. I genuinely could not live in my own home with any additional noise. We need traffic calming – but this proposal will increase the impact of the traffic, for residents near the proposed site, rather than ameliorate it.

Also, I am not getting younger and to disadvantage me by removing anywhere to unload shopping outside the house is distressing in the extreme. I have suffered from a back injury and had surgery which makes carrying anything for any distance very difficult indeed.

In summary I accept the laudable aims of the proposed crossing, but it is unworkable and personally distressing on these counts:

- It will increase the traffic noise directly outside the houses near the proposed site, rather than ameliorate it
- The sound of the beeping and traffic will affect residents and personally will affect my sleep, my work and my general health
- It will not "calm" the traffic in any sustainable way (and sustainability is surely an issue)
- There will nowhere for residents on this side of the road to unload shopping and deliveries
- It will force people to park elsewhere and have a knock-on effect on St George's Road (which is already rammed).

Please also let me add that I would be amenable to discussing alternatives. I understand the need for measures on Tachbrook Road and I would be happy to feed into a focussed discussion with residents and planners to achieve something workable.
