Expansion of The Willows CE Primary School, Stratford Upon Avon

Recommendation

That the Portfolio Holder approves the expansion of The Willows CE Primary School as detailed in the report.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 On 16 December 2010 the WCC Cabinet agreed to the Strategic Director carrying out formal consultation with stakeholders on proposals to expand The Willows CE Primary School. Formal consultations with stakeholders took place between 6 June and 15 July 2011.
- 1.2 At a meeting on 26 August 2011 the Portfolio Holder agreed to publish statutory consultation on the proposal to expand The Willows CE Primary School.

2. Statutory

- 2.1 Statutory notices were published on 15 September 2011 and the representation period finished on 13 October 2011. A copy of the statutory information for the expansion of The Willows CE Primary School is attached as **Appendix A** to this report.
- 2.2 Under the School Organisation regulations, as there have been no objections to the proposal, the matter can be determined by the County Council as the 'Decision Maker' up to the period of two months following the completion of statutory notices, which expires on 13 December 2011.

3. Confirmation of Decision

- 3.1 Given that there have been no objections to this statutory proposal the Portfolio Holder is now asked to consider approving the proposal to expand The Willows CE Primary school with effect from 1 September 2012.

Alteration description

4. A description of the proposed alteration and in the case of special school proposals, a description of the current special needs provision.

The proposal is to increase the Published Admission Number and to build at the school to support the additional numbers.

The proposal will require the provision of an additional four classrooms, additional group and practical space: an additional studio hall to facilitate PE; an extension to the existing school dining hall to accommodate additional numbers and to allow whole school assemblies and act of collective worship. It is also proposed to integrate a pre-school/nursery as part of the development.

This is a significant amount of work on a constrained occupied site and will be delivered in phases to obviate the need for temporary accommodation.

School capacity

The current capacity is 315. The prescribed alteration would see the capacity increase to 420.

The current PAN is 45 with up to 45 children being admitted in each year group. The proposal is to increase the school from 1.5 FE to 2 FE and a PAN of 60. In September 2012 we would look to see up to 60 children admitted into reception. The increased PAN will then feed through

the school year on year with 60 being taken in to reception each September thereafter.

With effect from September 2012 admissions, the PAN will be 60 at reception. The PAN in other year groups for September 2012 will remain at 45. The increased PAN will then apply for reception feeding through the school one year group at a time.

The rise in the birth rate will have a significant impact on some areas of the county from 2011 in some cases and from 2012 in others.

There are 8 primary schools serving Stratford Town. Steps have already been taken to increase the capacity of two of these in the past but pressure on places is still evident.

From September 2011 the total reception capacity in the area is 295. the most recent pupil forecasts show numbers living in the area and likely to be looking to secure places in reception are as shown below.

These figures do not include the impact of possible housing developments currently being considered for planning permission by the District Council.

Clearly, to do nothing will result in insufficient places being available in Stratford Town for the children who live in the area.

The Willows C of E Primary School was last inspected by Ofsted in June 2007. Inspectors deemed the school to be good.

The school is an extremely popular school and has agreed to take additional numbers this year to help with the shortage of places in the town. The school have agreed to take 58 pupils into reception but this still leaves 9 children on their waiting list.

To increase the PAN at the Willows C of E Primary School will support the Government's policy of expanding good and popular schools.
