# Portfolio Holder (Safeguarding, Early Intervention and Schools) Decision Making Session

# **Expansion of Oakfield Primary School, Rugby**

#### Recommendation

That the Portfolio Holder approves the expansion of Oakfield Primary School as detailed in the report.

#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 On 16 December 2010 the WCC Cabinet agreed to the Strategic Director carrying out formal consultation with stakeholders on proposals to expand Oakfield Primary School. Formal consultations with stakeholders took place between 6 June and 15 July 2011.
- 1.2 At a meeting on 26 August 2011 the Portfolio Holder agreed to publish statutory consultation on the proposal to expand Oakfield Primary School.

## 2. Statutory

- 2.1 Statutory notices were published on 15 September 2011 and the representation period finished on 13 October 2011. A copy of the statutory information for the expansion of Oakfield Primary School is attached as **Appendix A** to this report.
- 2.2 Under the School Organisation regulations, as there have been no objections to the proposal, the matter can be determined by the County Council as the 'Decision Maker' up to the period of two months following the completion of statutory notices, which expires on 13 December 2011.

#### 3. Confirmation of Decision

- 3.1 Given that there have been no objections to this statutory proposal the Portfolio Holder is now asked to consider approving the proposal to expand Oakfield Primary school with effect from 1 September 2012.
- 3.2 Equality issues will be considered as part of the on-going process.

#### **Alteration description**

**4.** A description of the proposed alteration and in the case of special school proposals, a description of the current special needs provision.

The proposal is to increase the Published Admission Number and to build at the school to support the additional numbers.

This will involve a campus solution with Key Stage 1 provision and Key Stage 2 provision being further developed. Costs of the development should not exceed £2,000,000 and will be met from the Warwickshire County Council Capital Programme.

The current capacity is 210. The prescribed alteration would see the capacity increase to 315.

The current PAN is 30 with up to 30 children being admitted in each year group. The proposal is to increase the school from 1 FE to 1.5 FE and a PAN of 45. In September 2012 we would look to see up to 45 children admitted into reception. The increased PAN will then feed through the school year on year with 45 being taken in to reception each September thereafter.

(c) where it is intended that proposals should be implemented in stages, the number of pupils to be admitted to the school in the first school year in which each stage will have been implemented:

With effect from September 2012 admissions, the PAN will be 45 at reception. The PAN in other year groups for September 2012 will remain at 30. The increased PAN will then apply for reception feeding through the school one year group at a time.

Numbers at the top end of the school are relatively low. This reflects numbers in the area before recent housing development and an increase in the birth rate.

Oakfield Primary School shares a campus with the Oakfield Children's Centre. Since the Children's Centre has opened the number of parents looking to secure places for their children at the Primary School has increased.

The rise in the birth rate will have a significant impact on some areas of the county from 2011 in some cases and from 2012 in others.

Parts of Rugby have been subject to large scale development over recent years and The Pavilions development has had a significant impact on the availability of school places. There is already significant pressure on primary school places and discussions with the Heads and Governors of neighbouring primary schools support the decision to expand provision at Oakfield.

Oakfield Primary School shares a site with Oakfield Children's Centre. There is also a Nursery on site. Since the Children's Centre has opened, the demand for places at Oakfield Primary School has increased.

Numbers in the area are forecast to continue to rise as the impact of the rise in the birth-rate and the continued housing development in the area feed through into the school system.

Other schools in the area are already almost full or at capacity. To do nothing will mean that there will be insufficient primary school places available in the area.

Oakfield Primary School was last inspected by Ofsted in May 2010 when it was judged to be satisfactory with some good features. The Inspectors reported that Oakfield is a satisfactory school that is improving steadily.

Mobility is very high as families move in and out of the area. The proportion of pupils eligible for free school meals is very high and has increased significantly over the last two years. The proportion of pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities is well above average, as is the proportion of pupils with statements of educational need.

Places in the area are under significant pressure after new housing development and an increase in the birthrate. An increase in the capacity of Oakfield is likely to impact on the social mix in the school population change.
