#### **Decision taken**

We approve the appended Instrument of Government for the Federated Governing Body of Our Lady's Alcester, St. Mary's Henley-in-Arden and St. Mary's Broadway (Worcestershire) Catholic Primary Schools effective from 1 September 2011.

### **Reasons for Decisions**

- 1. Following a full consultation carried out, during May June 2011, in accordance with The School Governance (Federations) (England) Regulations 2007, the governing bodies of Our Lady's Alcester, St. Mary's Henley-in-Arden and St. Mary's Broadway Catholic Primary Schools have decided to federate the three schools under one federated governing body with effect from 1 September 2011.
- 2. Under the above Regulations, the governing bodies of federating schools are required to agree jointly a draft Instrument of Government for the federated governing body and submit this to the Local Authority for approval. If the draft Instrument complies with the legal requirements for the constitution of a federated governing body, the Local Authority can approve the Instrument.

- 3. A draft Instrument complying with the legal requirements for the constitution of a federated governing body has been submitted to Warwickshire and Worcestershire Local Authorities by Our Lady's Alcester, St. Mary's Henley-in-Arden and St. Mary's Broadway Catholic Primary School governing bodies.
- 4. As the federating schools are Catholic Voluntary Aided Schools, the draft Instrument of Government also has to be approved by the Birmingham Catholic Diocesan Education Service. The draft Instrument has been initially approved by their Director of Education and will be formally submitted for approval by the Trustees at their meeting in mid-August.
- 5. Worcestershire Local Authority has been consulted on the constitution of the federated governing body and will be formally approving this draft Instrument of Government in mid-August also.
