# Changes to primary school priority areas in North Rugby

## Report of the Strategic Director for Children, Young People and Families

## Recommendation:

That the Area Committee considers the feedback to the consultation and agrees to change the priority areas of Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School, Boughton Leigh Junior School and Clifton-on-Dunsmore C of E Primary School as proposed.

## 1. Introduction

- 1.1 A major phase of a large housing development is planned within the priority area of Clifton-upon-Dunsmore C of E (Controlled) Primary School. Clifton Primary School currently takes children from its priority area, principally the villages of Clifton and Newton. It is full across all age groups and will be unable to accommodate the likely demand for places arising from the development. However, the nearest schools (Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School) all have significant numbers of places across all age groups. The Boughton Leigh schools have been extended in recent years to accommodate pupils from the Coton Park development.
- 1.2 It is proposed that part of the Clifton priority area be re-designated as a shared area of Brownsover Community Infant School and Boughton Leigh Infant School at the infant phase, and Boughton Leigh Junior School at the junior phase.
- 1.3 At its meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2006 the Cabinet agreed to consult stakeholders on this proposal. Formal consultation took place between 1<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> February and feedback from this consultation is set out below.
- 1.4 The determination of school priority areas is a matter for the Area Committee.



## 2. Background

- 2.1 The priority area of Clifton covers the parishes of Clifton-upon-Dunsmore and Newton and Biggin. A large housing development of some 877 units is in progress, in a number of phases at Coton Park, mostly located in the west of the parish of Newton and Biggin. A further part of the development extends into the parish of Churchover in the priority area of The Revel C of E (Aided) Primary School. To date some 293 houses have been completed but a further 584 houses are planned in the next phase in the Newton and Biggin parish and within the priority area of Clifton Primary School. It is forecast that this next phase could require some 15-25 places per year group across all primary school year groups.
- 2.2 In terms of meeting the demand for places, Clifton Primary School is currently full with 218 pupils for just 210 places and occupies a restricted site in the village of Clifton which cannot be expanded. The school is approximately 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> miles from the proposed development through Brownsover.
- 2.3 Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School, however, have spare places in all year groups and are located less than a mile from the development on an adjoining housing estate. Brownsover Community Infant School feeds mainly into Boughton Leigh Junior School at age seven years. Details of capacities and current and forecast pupil numbers for the four schools are given in the table below:

## 3. The proposal

3.1 The proposal is to change the priority area of Clifton Primary School by transferring an area of the parish of Newton and Biggin which covers the new estate, but not including the village of Newton, to a shared priority area with Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School. If approved, following formal consultations, the change would take effect from September 2008.



3.2 It is also proposed that an undesignated area between the railway line and the existing priority area of Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School be designated part of the Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School priority area. This area is the subject of an outline planning permission to develop 770 housing units, of an unknown type, up to 2011. A further, adjoining and currently undesignated area, including Ridge Drive, Furrow Close and Braids Close, would be added to the priority area of Clifton Primary School.

## 4. The impact of the proposal

It is not anticipated that the proposal would have any negative effect on Clifton Primary School and parents of pupils living in the new re-designated area will still be able to apply for a place at the school but would have a lower priority than pupils living in the priority area. The proposal should significantly reduce the current spare places retained at Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School in order to meet such developments. The attractiveness of these three schools will be further enhanced by the development of a flagship Children's Centre at the Boughton Leigh site.

## 5. Response to consultation

- 5.1 A consultation paper, a copy of which is attached as an **Appendix**, was sent to all parents of pupils at Clifton Primary School, Boughton Leigh Junior School, Boughton Leigh Infant School and Brownsover Community Infant School, the governing bodies of all primary schools in Rugby, local Diocesan Education Authorities, admissions authorities and neighbouring Local Authorities.
- 5.2 A summary of the responses to the consultation is set out below. Copy of all responses received by the closing date has been placed in the Group Rooms.

#### 5.2.1 Governing Body of Boughton Leigh Junior School

Governor confirmed that the school has the capacity to accept the extra pupils and fully supports the proposal.

#### 5.2.2 Governing Body of Brownsover Community Infant School

The governing body supports the proposed changes to its priority area.

# 5.2.3 Governing Body of Clifton-upon-Dunsmore Cof E (Controlled) Primary School

The governing body supports the proposed changes to its priority area.



#### 5.2.4 Clifton-upon-Dunsmore Parish Council

Parish Councillors would like to see pupil numbers maintained and not increased at Clifton Primary School.

#### Comment

This is the intention behind the proposal.

#### 5.2.5 Newton and Biggin Parish Council

The proposed changes would remove four, long-established properties (Newton Lane Cottage, Newton Manor Farm, Newton Manor Cottage and Newton Manor Bungalow) from the priority area of Clifton Primary School. This would not be the case if the new parish boundary were adopted.

#### Comment

The proposed boundary remains the preferred choice as it provides a boundary with both of the Infant schools which would serve the area and allows for potential enlargement of the Coton Park development beyond housing current plans.

#### 5.2.6 Parent of children at Clifton Primary School

- Will the addition of four roads, on 'The Links' development, to the Clifton priority area result in pupils in Newton not being guaranteed a place in the long term?
- Concerned that enlarging the Clifton priority area may result in more appeals.

#### Comment

Although the small Links development is being added to the Clifton priority area, the development comprises just four small roads. The overwhelming majority of pupils living on The Links already attend Clifton Primary School. The overall effect of the proposed change will be to reduce the priority area of Clifton Primary School. It is the case that The Links is nearer to Clifton Primary School than the village of Newton but as the school currently admits 50% of its intake from outside its priority area it will be able to accommodate all pupils within its priority area.

#### 6. Summary

A reduction in the Clifton Primary School priority area is necessary as the school will be unable to meet the likely demand for school places from a new housing development at Coton Park. Consultation on this proposal, along with other modifications to the priority areas of Clifton Primary School, Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School, has the support of each of the schools directly involved and has revealed no opposition.



## 7. Recommendation

Members are asked to consider the feedback to the consultation and agree to change the priority areas of Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School, Boughton Leigh Junior School and Clifton-on-Dunsmore C of E Primary School as proposed.

## **Consultation Paper - January 2007**

## Changes to primary school priority areas in North Rugby

#### The Proposal

1. The priority area of Clifton-upon-Dunsmore C of E (Controlled) Primary School comprises the parishes of Clifton-upon-Dunsmore and Newton and Biggin. The proposal is to transfer some of the parish of Newton and Biggin, including part of the Coton Park housing development, to the priority areas of Brownsover Community Infant School, Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School. If approved the change would take effect from September 2008 admissions.

2. It is also proposed that an undesignated area between the railway line and the existing priority area of Boughton Leigh Infant School and Boughton Leigh Junior School be designated part of the Boughton Leigh Infant and Boughton Leigh Junior School priority area. This area is the subject of an outline planning permission to develop 770 housing units, of an unknown type, up to 2011. A further adjoining and currently undesignated area, including Ridge Drive, Furrow Close, Braids Close and Viaduct Close would be added to the priority area of Clifton C of E Primary School.

#### Background

3. A school priority area is a geographical area defined by the school's admission authority, in this case the County Council. If a school is oversubscribed, the admission policy will ensure that children living in the priority area are given places before other applicants. There is no guarantee that all pupils living within a school's priority area will be admitted, but parents will have a strong expectation that places will generally be available at their priority area school.

4. The priority area of Clifton C of E Primary School covers the parishes of Clifton-upon-Dunsmore and Newton and Biggin. A large housing development of some 877 units is in progress, in a number of phases at Coton Park, mostly located in the west of the parish of Newton and Biggin. A further part of the development extends into the parish of Churchover in the priority area of The Revel C of E (Aided) Primary School. To date some 293 houses have been completed but a further 584 houses are planned in the next phase in the Newton and Biggin parish and within the priority area of Clifton C of E Primary School. It is forecast that this next phase could require some 15-25 places per year group across all primary school year groups. 

#### Why are the changes necessary?

6. If, as forecast, the next phase of the major housing development at Coton Park produces 15 to 25 pupils per year group, Clifton C of E Primary School will be unable to accommodate them as it is already full across all age groups although not all pupils live within the Priority areas. However, the nearest schools (Brownsover Community Infant, Boughton Leigh Infant and Boughton Leigh Junior School) all have significant numbers of places across all age groups. The Boughton Leigh schools have been extended in recent years to accommodate pupils from the Coton Park development.

7. In relation to the proposal to also add the undesignated area above the railway line to the priority area of Boughton Leigh Infant and Boughton Leigh Junior School, this will enable the schools to plan for further admissions and they do have sufficient places to accommodate the additional pupils. The addition of three existing roads to the Clifton-upon-Dunsmore priority area can be accommodated by the school within its existing admission number.

8. It is not anticipated that the proposal would have any negative effect on pupil numbers at Clifton C of E Primary School. The school would continue to provide a Church of England ethos in the locality. The parents of pupils living on the new housing development in the redesignated area will still be able to apply for a place at the school but would have a lower priority than pupils living in the priority area. The proposal should significantly reduce the current spare places retained at Brownsover Community Infant, Boughton Leigh Infant and Boughton Leigh Junior School in order to meet such developments. The attractiveness of these three schools will be further enhanced by the development of a flagship Children's Centre at the Boughton Leigh site. It is considered that these schools can also meet the likely demand from this development.

#### When would the changes take effect?

9. If approved, the amendment to the school priority areas would take effect from September 2008 admissions onwards.

#### What happens next?

10. This consultation paper is being sent to all parents of pupils at Clifton C of E Primary, Boughton Leigh Junior, Boughton Leigh Infant and Brownsover Community Infant schools, the governing bodies of all primary schools in Rugby, local Diocesan Education Authorities, admissions authorities and neighbouring Local Authorities.

11. Changes to the priority areas of community and controlled schools are determined by the Area Committee following formal consultation with stakeholders.
