Area Community Learning Partnership (ACLP) for Warwick District, Progress Report 2006/07 and Action Plan for 2007/08

Report of the Area Community Learning Partnership

Recommendations:

- (1) That the progress made in the development of the Community Learning Strategy and the multi-agency Community Learning Plan for Rugby Borough is noted.
- (2) That the detailed progress report against 2006/07 actions be endorsed.
- (3) That a finalised Area Community Learning Plan for 2007/08 is made available to the Area Committee for information in late summer/early autumn.

1. Background

- 1.1 The development of the Community Learning Strategy and multi-agency Community Learning Plans enable the Local Authority and all partner organisations:
 - To engage in new ways with the local community, so that learners, parents and carers, and our partners are all working together to help learners of all ages to achieve their potential.
 - To enhance communication and understanding across the range of learning provision.
 - To ensure that increasingly complex arrangements for learning:
 - Are planned more coherently to avoid needless duplication
 - Have agencies working together not in competition with each other
 - Seek to respond to the differing needs of local communities
 - Are subject to local democratic scrutiny.
- 1.2 The Area Community Learning Partnership (ACLP), which has met regularly since April 2003, is co-ordinated and serviced by the Schools and Communities Team of the Children, Young People and Families Directorate and is the vehicle through which the Area Community Learning Plan has been developed.



- 1.3 The ACLP is currently the 'Lifelong Learning Theme Group' for the Rugby Forward (the Local Strategic Partnership).
- 1.4 Progress against the 2006/07 action plan was monitored by the Partnership on a regular basis and all partner agencies contributed to the process. A full progress report for 2006/07 is attached at **Appendix A**.

2. The Area Community Learning Plan 2005/08

- 2.1 Progress made against the Community Learning Plan for 2006/07 has been encouraging and has given partner agencies a firm basis to build upon when considering future working.
- 2.2 The ACLP is a key vehicle for supporting the extended services agenda within localities. It is also key to encouraging a multi-agency response to meeting the objectives of the Local Area Agreement allowing flexibility and providing local solutions.
- 2.3 A meeting is scheduled for late June to consider the priorities and actions identified by the LAA Block Leads within the Borough. This in turn will enable the ACLP to consider future working and develop an action plan for 2007/08. Although this means that the action plan will be produced later than within our usual timescale, we feel it is imperative to recognise the vital role the ACLP will have in supporting the lifelong learning agenda within the Borough and to reflect the priorities of the LAA and the Sustainable Communities Strategy.
- 2.4 The ACLP welcomes the comments of Area Committee and will look to finalise the plan in late summer. A copy of the finalised plan will be shared with Members in late summer/early autumn.
