Report of the Strategic Director of Environment and Economy

Recommendation

That Members:-

- 1. Support the Capital Programme for Integrated Transport for Warwick area given in Table 1.
- 2. Support the schemes identified in Table 3 for the delegated budget.
- 3. Agree to the recommendation that schemes which remain on the list of delegated budget requests for three years are removed from future lists.
- 4. Support the allocation of the additional capital funding for road maintenance as set out in Paragraph 5.1.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 A seminar for Warwick Area Committee Members was held on 24th January 2006. At the seminar a draft 2006-07 programme of integrated transport works and the allocation of additional road maintenance funding were discussed. The purpose of this report is to enable Warwick Area Committee to formally support the proposed programme and allocation of funding for Warwick Area.
- 1.2 The full programme for all five Area Committees will be reported to Cabinet on 4th May 2006.

2. Capital Programme for Warwick Area

2.1 The draft Capital Programme for Integrated Transport is given in Table 1. It is recommended that Area Committee resolves to support this programme. A costed programme of schemes will then be developed within the resources available, and reported to Cabinet in May.

3. Countywide Projects

3.1 In addition to the programme listed in Table 1 there are a number of countywide allocations which Cabinet will be asked to approve. These are listed in Table 2, below. A programme of schemes for these allocations will be developed during the year with appropriate consultation with local Members and Area Committees.

4. Delegated Budget for Warwick Area

- 4.1 At Cabinet on 12th January 2006 it was agreed that a sum of £40,000 would be delegated to each Area Committee to allocate to transport projects according to local priorities. A list of possible schemes for such funding was presented to Members at the seminar on 24th January.
- 4.2 Table 3 details the schemes selected by Members for implementation in 2006-07.

4.3 Permanent vehicle activated signs were requested at various locations. However, these signs are mainly for use at accident hot-spots. Therefore it was agreed that temporary speed visor signs, funded from the revenue budget, would be installed at the locations detailed in Table 4.

4.4 Delegated budget schemes not selected for implementation will remain on the list for consideration in 2007-08. It is recommended that if a scheme remains on the list for three years without being selected then it is removed from future lists. This will avoid the same proposals being re-visited year on year.

5. Additional Road Maintenance Funding

- 5.1 At the seminar Members were made aware of the additional £300,000 available for capital funded road maintenance schemes. Two suggested options were provided for Members at the seminar. Members chose Suggestion 2 as follows;
 - (i) £25,000 for streetscape improvements in the urban areas, particularly sign and column painting
 - (ii) £30,000 for drainage improvements
 - (iii) £75,000 for street lighting improvements with the main focus on upgrading the Mercury Lamps
 - (iv) £170,000 for footway surfacing with particular emphasis on the smaller lengths of footway in poor condition throughout the area to reduce future patching spend.



5.2 A programme of schemes for these allocations will now be developed and presented to Members for their consideration at the May Area Committee.


