## Home Composting Scheme

## Report of the Strategic Director for Environment and Economy on behalf of the Officers Group

### Summary

This report updates Members on the progress made regarding the countywide Home Composting scheme.

### Recommendation

Members note the contents of this report.

### 1. Background

- 1.1 At the last Partnership meeting, members received a report on Warwickshire's home composting scheme, partnered with Wrap over the past four years. At that meeting members asked for a further update of the scheme, due to the price increases being introduced and less subsidy being given by Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra), this could affect achieving the waste minimisation target.
- 1.2 To remind members, from 1 April 2008, Wrap increased their prices from £10, for a 330, litre bin to £20 and from £8 to £17 for a 220 litre bin. During 2007/8, 5,275 bins were sold, bringing the total number of sales, up to April 2008, to 19,874. The total percentage of households using the Wrap campaign composters was 8.13%.

## 2. Campaign 2008/09

2.1 Up to the end of August 2009, only 830 bins have been sold. To try and enhance these sales during the autumn, a bin sale is planned, offering a £4 discount to the first 1000 residents purchasing their first composter. An increased amount of promotional work will also be done to highlight the benefits of composting at home.




## 3. Market Research

- 3.1 Two further pieces of research have been carried out over the last few months, one by Wrap, covering research on a national scale and another by the Warwickshire Waste Partnership who have also been conducting some further research, not just on those residents who have purchased Wrap composters, but on the number of other residents within the county who are composting.
- 3.2 With regard to Wrap research, they have estimated that Warwickshire has 184,000 houses with gardens out of a household total of 222,000. They have used a very small sample of households across Warwickshire, 71 in all, to come to the conclusion that we have 29% of households doing their own composting, plus a further 5.6% of new households composting using Wrap composters (the remaining 2.8% of the Wrap sales are existing composter users), which gives an estimate of 34.6% of households carrying out home composting.
- 3.3 The Warwickshire Observatory do not feel the Wrap figure is a true representation of the composting activities conducted by Warwickshire residents as the sample of 71 households is rather small.
- 3.4 The Waste Partnership conducted a survey, in the form of a competition, during August 2008 (**Appendix A**). The survey was open to all Warwickshire residents who either completed the survey on-line or by surveys distributed at local events in Nuneaton, Learnington and Stratford. It was also published in the Rugby Choice magazine, and press articles went out across the county.

## 4. Warwickshire's Own Key Findings

- 4.1 353 completed responses were received, this is considered a robust sample.
- 4.2 A staggering 78.5% of respondents stated that they compost at home.
- 4.3 Of those composting at home, 52% either purchased their compost bin at a garden centre, made their own, use a compost heap or other means. This leaves 48% who purchased through the Wrap scheme.
- 4.4 If the 48% of residents, composting through Wraps subsidised scheme, is equal to 8.13% (reported in our last report), then the 52% of residents composting by other means is equal to 8.8%, giving us an overall Warwickshire composting rate of 16.93%. Warwickshire's target within the Waste Minimisation Strategy is for 15% of householders to be treating compostable waste at home by 2010/11 and 20% by 2012/13.
- 4.5 When comparing the satisfaction element of the chosen method of composting, the level of very satisfied residents is higher with residents who purchased through the Wrap scheme. The level of fairly satisfied residents is, however, higher with those who did not purchase through an the Wrap Scheme.






### Figure 1: Satisfaction with Chosen Method of Composting

- 4.6 Of those respondents composting, 41% said they were 'very successful' in producing compost, 42% said that they were 'fairly successful', 7% said that they were 'not very successful' whilst 1% said that they were 'not at all successful'. Of the remainder, 9% did not state how successful they were at producing compost.
- 4.7 When comparing the success in producing compost, the level of very successful residents is higher with those who purchased through the Wrap scheme (Wrap provide extra support to those purchasers). The level of fairly satisfied residents is, however, higher with those who did not purchase through an the Wrap Scheme.

4.8 Respondents were asked whether they thought that additional encouragement or support was necessary, 22% of respondents did not think that there was a need for any further encouragement or support. Of the respondents who did want further support, 44% thought that literature was necessary, 44% thought that a web page was necessary.



- 4.9 90% of respondents would recommend composting to others.
- 4.10 To support those who have indicated problems encountered with compost bins, a follow up advice sheet will be drawn up and sent to them. They will also be made aware of other information services such as the Warwickshire County Council Home Composting web page.
