1. Recommended Decision

1.1 That the Portfolio Holder for Transport and Environment agrees that The Warwickshire County Council (The Ridgeway & Bishopton Lane, Stratford upon Avon)(Restricted Road) Order 2022 be introduced as advertised.

2. Reasons for decisions

- 2.1 The revocation of The Warwickshire County Council (The Ridgeway, Stratford upon Avon) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 2004 has been proposed and, as a consequence, a 30mph speed limit will come into force by virtue of the street lighting. A plan showing the effect of this proposal is appended to this report in Appendix A.
- 2.2 These proposals were published on 16th December 2021 in the Stratford Observer and notices were also displayed on site. This report considers the objections received as a result of the consultation. See Appendix B
- 2.3 The Statement of Reasons for the proposed speed limit changes is appended to this report in Appendix C.

3. Background information

- 3.1 The Ridgeway Order also includes Bishopton Lane as far as Timothy's Bridge Road and the A422 Alcester Road between The Ridgeway, to the A46.
- 3.2 In 2007, a new Speed Management Strategy was approved by the County Council as a result of the Speed Limit Circular 01/2006 issued by the Department for Transport (DfT). This Circular was subsequently superseded by Circular 01/2013.

The Circular covers three key areas: Education; Engineering; and Enforcement. The setting of speed limits is a key element of this strategy. See Appendix D

- 3.3 The DfT Circular 01/2013 advises that the following criteria are applied when setting speed limits:
 - (i) Analysing the existing speed data to identify the mean speed of drivers;
 - (ii) To consider the environment and nature of the road; and
 - (iii) To consider any relevant injury accident data.

The three roads each contain a significant length of frontage which is undergoing substantial planned housing development and a number of new access roads.

Along these routes there have been three personal injury collisions in the past three years. The relationship between speed and likelihood of collisions as well as severity of injury is complex, but there is a correlation. Lower speed limits will improve the safety of the three roads and the proposed new accesses.

- 3.4 The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 enables the Council to make orders prohibiting the driving of motor vehicles on a road at a speed exceeding that specified in the order. The matters that the Council must take into consideration when making a decision upon making such an order are also set out in Appendix D annexed.
- 3.5 This proposal was originally put forward in November 2017 and attracted one Objection from the Police. Since then, a system of centre carriageway 'ladder markings' has been put forward in an effort to encourage motorists to adhere to the new 30mph limit. See Appendix E. The Police no longer object.
- 3.6 The previous Report was presented to the Portfolio Holder in September 2018 and was signed off to be introduced as advertised. However, problems on site meant the Developer was not in a position to introduce the TRO within the two-year time frame allowed and as a consequence, the original proposal had to 'lapse' and the whole TRO process re-started at zero cost to WCC. See Appendix F

4. Consultation

- 4.1 Consultation has been carried out with the Local Member, Local Borough Council, Warwickshire Police, Fire Service, Ambulance Service, Road Haulage Association and other statutory consultees.
- 4.2 Public notices advertising the revocation of The Warwickshire County Council (The Ridgeway, Stratford upon Avon) (40mph Speed limit) Order 2004, "The Warwickshire County Council (The Ridgeway & Bishopton Lane, Stratford upon Avon) (Restricted Road) Order 2022" were published in the Stratford Observer newspaper on 16.12.21 (Appendix B). Notices were also displayed on street outlining the proposals. This resulted in the receipt of two Objections, summarised

There are no alternative uses for the contribution and the addition of the scheme will not affect the overall level of available capital resources.
- 5.2 It has been identified that to assist the motorists to adhere to the lower speed limit certain traffic calming features may need to be installed. The Planning Officers have secured a S278 Bond from the Developer to cover all of the costs of this particular element, which would be introduced before occupancy of the first property is completed.

2. STATEMENT OF REASONS

2.1 Bishopton Lane & The Ridgeway, Stratford

Warwickshire County Council has received a S278 Minor works application for a residential development of 500 homes along Bishopton Lane and The Ridgeway. As part of the development they need to implement various speed reduction measures including installation of new lower speed limit signs to the two roads in that locale.

Currently, there is a 40mph speed limit Order in place along these routes. This length of Highway will soon include a number of accesses leading into new housing developments.

The proposal is to revoke the existing 40mph speed limit along these roads which will then be replaced by a 30mph Traffic Regulation Order. (TRO) Street lighting does not extend the whole length of the roads mentioned, so a 30mph by virtue of the street lighting is not possible.

Reducing the current speed limit should have the effect of slowing motorists down to assist turning traffic in/out of the new housing developments, preserve visibility and aid road safety.

- 3.1 Plan Ref. MWT21 118 01 to be included in Schedule 1 and attached to the Order.
- 3.2 <u>Bishopton Lane Existing 40mph to become 30mph.</u>
 - (i) From a point on the western side of the existing traffic island junction with Timothy's Bridge Road, in a generally south west direction for the whole length of the road to its junction with The Ridgeway, a distance of 1250m.

 - (ii) From a point in line with the north west elevation of property No 2 The Ridgeway in a generally south east direction for the whole length of the road to its junction with the A422 Alcester Road, a distance of 351m.
- 3.4 The Ridgeway Existing 60mph to become 30mph.
 - (iii) From a point in line with the north west elevation of property No 2 The Ridgeway in a generally north west direction for a distance of 200m.
- 4. Existing Order to be revoked.
- 4.1 The Warwickshire County Council (The Ridgeway, Stratford upon Avon) (40mph Speed limit) Order 2004.
- 4.2 WCC reference No 408

The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 enables the Council to make Orders prohibiting the driving of motor vehicles on a road at a speed exceeding that specified in the Order, or directing that a road on which there is provided a system of street lighting furnished by means of lamps placed not more than 183 metres apart shall become a restricted road (subject to a speed limit of 30 mph) or that it shall cease to be a restricted road.

Speed Limit Orders and Restricted Road Roads remain in force until superseded or revoked.

The Department for Transport's Circular 01/2013 'Setting Local Speed Limits' should be the basis for assessments of local speed limits, for developing route management strategies and for developing speed management strategies required as part of the Local Transport Plan process. Circular 01/2013 requires that "speed limits should be evidence-led and self-explaining and seek to reinforce people's assessment of what is a safe speed to travel. They should encourage self-compliance. Speed limits should be seen by drivers as the maximum rather than a target speed. Traffic authorities set local speed limits in situations where local needs and conditions suggest a speed limit which is lower than the national speed limit."


In deciding whether or not to make an Order or give a Direction, the Council is required to have regard to the matters set out in section 122 of the 1984 Act. Section 122(1) requires the Council to exercise the functions conferred on it by the 1984 Act as (so far as practicable having regard to the matters specified in section 122(2)) to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians), and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway.

The matters to which the Council must have regard are:-

- the desirability of securing and maintaining reasonable access to premises
- the effect on the amenities of any locality affected and the importance of regulating and restricting the use of roads by heavy commercial vehicles so as to preserve or improve the amenities of the areas through which the roads run
- the national air quality strategy prepared under section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1995
- the importance of facilitating the passage of public service vehicles and of securing the safety and convenience of persons using or desiring to use such vehicles
- and any other matters appearing to the Council to be relevant

Therefore whilst the overall objective of the Council must be to secure the expeditious convenient and safe movement of vehicular traffic this cannot prevent statutory powers from being used for the specific purposes identified in section 122(1) and that a balance has to be achieved between the overall objective and the matters set out in section 122(2)

Background Information

The revocation of The Warwickshire County Council (The Ridgeway, Stratford upon Avon) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 2004 has been proposed and, as a consequence, a 30mph speed limit will come into force by virtue of the street lighting. A plan showing the effect of this proposal is appended to the published report in Appendix A.

Rather than pursue two separate consultation processes, it was deemed to be more efficient to combine "The Warwickshire County Council (The Ridgeway & Bishopton Lane, Stratford upon Avon)(Restricted Road) Order 2017"; and "The Warwickshire County Council (A422 Alcester Road, Stratford upon Avon)(Restricted Road) Order 2017" and treat them as one. It is for this reason the report shows two Statement of Reasons.

These proposals were published on 26 October 2017 in the Stratford Observer and notices were also displayed on site.

Dear Mr McDonell,

I have copied my WCC Councillor, Tim Sinclair, and my SDC Councillor, the Leader of SDC, Mr Tony Jefferson, for assistance with this objection.

I wish to object to you order as it does not meet Warwickshire County Council's or Stratford District Council's commitment to Climate Change, Green environmental measures and most importantly the promotion of safe utility cycling in the District/County.

WCC, SDC and Stratford Town Council have all made hugely virtuous statements about the above measures and "emergency" but sadly, as here, the action does not begin to follow the VS rhetoric. For example, in SOA District there has not been a single mile of new segregated cycle paths, not one school has safe utility cycle paths in three approach directions, some like Clopton School, KES, SGGS and others not one single safe route. This must change and safe, <u>segregated</u> cycle paths must be the priority. This road and even this new estate fails to do so. Children must cycle along Bishopton Lane to schools and recreation at present, and with hugely increased traffic flow with the huge new estate, this will make the situation even more dangerous if not lethal.

Proposal

I propose that instead:

- 1. The Bishopton Road traffic is reduced to 20MPH
- 2. A new <u>segregated</u> (with raised kerb border) two way cycle lane is introduced the whole length of Bishopton
- 3. A new Foot and cycle bridge is introduced over the canal as the present situation is very dangerous and I have seen a few near misses of pedestrians and cyclists hit by oncoming traffic.

Traffic planning have utterly failed to install safe <u>segregated</u> cycleways in the town and district, here is an opportunity to redress these failings.

I'd like to object to the speed limit reduction on Bishopton Lane in Stratford upon Avon on the following grounds.

Firstly the statement of reasons is completely incorrect.

Section 2:


The county council is under no obligation to reduce the speed limit. The single access on Bishopton Lane has a roundabout geometry which will intrinsically reduce the speed of vehicles travelling along Bishopton Lane - this will reduce the speed at which vehicles will approach the roundabout obviating the necessity for speed limit reductions.

There is no evidence for the requirement for a speed limit reduction given in the statement of reasons. No accident data, no speed data. Government guidance is that these changes should be evidence led - there is no evidence in the statement of reasons.

The Statement of reasons is completely inadequate and fails to demonstrate the necessity of a speed limit reduction.
