# Decision to be made by the Leader of the Council – S278 Developer – funded Improvement Scheme at Shottery Link Road, Stratford-upon-Avon

### Decision taken

That the Leader of the Council gives approval to the award of the S278 Fully developerfunded highway improvement scheme at the Shottery Link Road, Stratford upon Avon.

#### **Reasons for decisions**

- 1.1 At the Council meeting on the 21 March 2017approval was given to add the Shottery Link Road, Stratford upon Avon fully funded developer highways scheme to the capital programme at an estimated cost of £1.5M. Since this submission the scope of the scheme has increased and the estimate for the schemes cost has been increased in the quarterly capital reporting to £3.5m.
- 1.2 Under Warwickshire County Council's Framework Contract for the Provision of Construction Works 2019, a developer nominated supplier was invited to submit their quotation for this scheme under the Package Order Call Off Contract (POCOC). The evaluation and checking of this return is currently underway and the I works price including contingencies is expected to be finalised at a value in the region of £3.8M
- 1.3 Approval is requested to Award this contract to the supplier following the conclusion of the assessment of tender

#### **Background information**

2.1 A planning application was submitted to Stratford-on-Avon District Council by J S Bloor (Tewkesbury) Ltd and Hallam Land Management Ltd for a development of up to 800 dwellings and community facilities. Planning permission was granted on appeal on 24 October 2012 (ref: 09/02196/OUT and APP/J3720/A/11/2163206) and this requires the Developers to provide a link road from A422 Alcester Road to B439 Evesham Road.

- 2.2 There are three highway improvement schemes which are proposed to be delivered by the County Council:
  - A new access with ghost right turn lane on A422 Alcester Road;
  - · A Puffin crossing on A422 Alcester Road; and
  - · A new roundabout on B439 Evesham Road.
- 2.3 The implementation of a Puffin crossing on Alcester Road will be subject to a separate statutory notice and consultation procedure and any objections will be reported to the Portfolio Holder for Transport and Planning.
- 2.4 The link road will connect to the A46/A422 at the Wildmoor roundabout and the Developers will enter into an agreement with Highways England regarding the delivery of these works. The link road itself will be delivered by the Developers who will both enter into a S38 agreement with the County Council. The link road will be offered for adoption as highway once it has been completed to the satisfaction of the County Council. Plans showing the proposed highway improvements are included in Appendix A.
- 2.5 Subject to the recommendation being agreed, the County Council will enter into a Section 278 agreement with the Developers to undertake the works at an estimated cost of £3,800,000 including fees. Under the agreement the costs will be fully funded by the Developers.

## Financial implications

As the new highway assets which are being created through these schemes will come on to the Council's balance sheet once completed, the costs incurred by the Council need to be treated as capital expenditure.

Section 278 schemes are fully funded by developer contributions which are ring-fenced for the schemes described in the sections above. There are no alternative uses for the contributions and the addition of these schemes will not affect the overall level of available capital resources.

The Developer has already committed to funding the technical review work by accepting the Council's fee estimates. The Council's fees for technical review are always collected in advance of the s278 agreement being signed.

Procurement and subsequent award of construction contracts will only take place subject to the applicable Section 278 agreements being signed, which will provide 100% of the funding. The commencement of the works is dependent on the completion of the technical review, procurement and contractor mobilisation processes. Any slippage or increase in costs due to changes in the scope of the works will be reported in the normal quarterly monitoring process.

# **Environmental implications**

The environmental impacts of developer-funded highway schemes are considered through the planning approval process.

The contractors on the Council's Framework Contract for the Provision of Engineering and Construction Works (WCC 6012) have all demonstrated that they hold a certificate of compliance with BS EN ISO 140001 (or equivalent) or have otherwise satisfactorily demonstrated their policies and arrangements for the management of construction-related environmental issues
