

**Proposal to Establish Specialist Resourced Provision at Glendale School – Overview of Consultation Responses (17 of 33 responses provided comment)**

<b>Reasons For Proposal</b>	<b>WCC response</b>
It is vital that very young children have access to SEN support in a mainstream school that will help their needs	
It will support the school in meeting existing pupil needs	
Provision needs to be resourced effectively	Sufficient funding will be provided to the SRP so that additional staff and resources can be put in place
Why is there not another Specialist School being built?	Specialist Resourced Provision is being put in place across the county to enable those pupils who can access mainstream provision with additional support to be able to do so, thus reducing the pressure on special school places and reducing the distance travelled to school. WCC are also increasing the number of places at local special schools as part of meeting the wider special educational needs sufficiency requirements.

There are two schools in Nuneaton that are tailored to deal with children with issues in relation to SEN and communication. Glendale should not be using time money and resources to focus and cater to children with additional needs. When it already seems stretched at times with the children already under their care. The employment of specialist staff is essential, as appropriate use of the school buildings and outside areas. It cannot add to the workload of current staff in the school. Would be great for pupils to be able to continue at Nursery Hill with specialist support	
<b>Reasons Against Proposal</b>	<b>WCC response</b>
Nursery hill Primary should not be targeted to become an SRP at this time. There is already considerable demand from current students with Sen and the school often cannot meet all the need. If this facility was being established to meet the needs of the SEN children already attending Nursery Hill, and its catchment area, this would be an amazing resource. It feels like we are just being lumbered with an even bigger burden of need at a time when the school is trying its best to flourish.
